Stark County Ski Club Meeting
January 20, 2014
E. B.'s Pub – Meadowlake Golf Course

President Jim Kovach called the meeting to order at 7 pm. Fifty-four (54) people were in attendance, and there was one guest.

Reports:

President: Jim Kovach reported that we have a new member of the club, Candice and Justin Ford had a baby girl, Isabelle Rose, on Sunday, January 18. Jim stated we are using the Blossom money towards keeping trip pricing down and towards trip losses, which was the intent when raising it. The Board and Executive Committee are ok with running the Casino and H & H trips at a loss and using Blossom money.

Treasurer: Donna Brancifort reported the balance in the club bank account. Donna then further explained that \$1,796 in Blossom money has been used so far this year. \$1,100 of that is certificates redeemed from workers and \$696 to cover losses on the Peek n Peak trip, which was expected because it ran as a value trip for member appreciation. Donna also said the early sign up discounts were popular and helpful in increasing early/better participation on 1-2 day trips.

Socials: Donna reported for Diane that 21 people enjoyed a social at Gervasi's January 19. An impromptu social at Clearfork was enjoyed by a few members on January 10. Diane will try to get a social scheduled in between ski trips for February so watch for announcements.

Trip Committee: Art Pokopac called for the following trip reports:

Trip Reports:

Peak n Peek, NY Jan. 11. Trip Leader Bill Bail reported they had 89 on the trip and the Pk n Pk representative commented that was the largest group they have ever printed tickets for. The weather and snow conditions were great and there were no injuries. Bill said there was a nice mix of new and seasoned skiers on the trip. Bill thanked Gary Johnson for handling the 2nd bus.

Seven Springs, PA Jan. 16. Trip Leader Art Pokopac reported they took 51 people. There was fog but they had a good time and no injuries.

Holiday Valley /Casino Jan. 24/25. \$215 Trip leaders John Masalko / Mike Lockhart. 1 night lodging at casino, 2 days skiing at HV. Mike reported they have 31 signed up and gave a rundown of the itinerary.

Holiday Valley/Holimont Wingate Jan. 28-30. \$255 Trip leader is Bob Hoff. 70s theme party. Ski 1 day each at HV and Holimont or both days at HV. Let Bob know what ski option you would like. 41 people signed up and Bob will still take applications. One female needed.

Whitefish, MT Feb. 7-14. Train leader Jim Kovach, Plane leader Gail Vogt. Gail will be sending out parking options to those taking the plane. Jim is looking into eating options. Contact Bill Bail if you would like information on dog sledding which is available 20 minutes north of Whitefish and \$100 pp.

Holimont, NY Feb. 19. \$65 Trip leaders Jeri and Gary Johnson. 23 people signed up

Okemo/Mt. Snow, VT Feb. 22-27 by train. Trip leader, Zee Kovach. \$639. 40 going on this trip. There will be a bus available to travel to eating venues.

Holiday Valley, NY March 14. Mardi Gras Trip leader Justin Ford. \$75

*remember, your check for one day trips will not be cashed until after the trip runs, so please sign up and get these trips filled so we don't have to cancel.

New Business:

Parking: It is very IMPORTANT that we park where the map in the newsletter shows. We should not be taking employee and contractor parking spots.

Important Trip Protocols: Please remember that there are bus protocols that are on the website to make everyone's trip enjoyable. There should be no boots on the bus unless the trip leader has specified there is room or you can put them under **your** seat. You should not take two seats for your own comfort when others are still trying to find seating. Also important, fill out the trip application completely. When there are changes that need made to a trip – an email address or phone number is crucial for keeping you informed. As well as having an emergency contact listed that is not on the trip with you. Trip leaders have been instructed they may return an incomplete form and your spot will not be secured until it is returned complete.

Braxton Martin Sitski Raffle: Jennifer Martin reported that they had approximately \$1,500 in ticket sales and another \$1,000 from the GoFund me site and have raised the amount needed to purchase a sitski for their son Braxton. She and Braxton thanked everyone who contributed. Braxton pulled two tickets and the winner of the Snowboard was Rod Ramsey and the winner of the Skis was Jennifer Stephan.

Miscellaneous: The question was asked "How do we decide on trips" and a brief explanation was given. Determining factors include: where hasn't the club been in a while, what other trips are CMSC and CMSC clubs running, and price of trips. Art will be attending the Mountain Travel Symposium this year to find our best value trip options. Remember our club number at Snowtrails is M37 for a discount.

Meeting Adjournment:

Meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m. and the 50/50 raffle, door prize and ski/snowboard drawings followed adjournment of meeting. Steve Patterson was the 50/50 raffle winner \$86 (total pot \$172).

Stark County Ski Club Bus Seating and Baggage Protocol:

Stark County Ski Club trips are scheduled well in advance and priced based on number of participants, number of bus seats available and cost of bus transportation services. Bus size needs are determined by the number of people, length of trip, and estimated amount of passenger luggage (ski bag, boot bag, and one piece of luggage, as the trip requires). The following guidelines have been established for the benefit of all of our club membership while traveling by bus or motor-coach.

- All skis/snowboards and all ski /snowboard boots must be in a proper equipment bag.
- No trip participant may board the bus/motor coach before the trip leader has boarded and has cleared the coach for loading. Baggage loading in bus bays may commence as soon as the driver has opened the bays.
- The two front seats of the bus, on either side of the aisle, are for use of the trip leader as he or she sees fit. They may open one of those pairs of seats to other passengers at their discretion. Special requests of passengers may be considered, but only granted by the trip leader.
- Unless the trip leader indicates that space is available inside the bus, all baggage stated above must be stowed in the bus baggage bays. If participants wish to have their ski boots on the bus, the boots must fit under their own seat.
- Unless indicated by the trip leader, a participant shall not place their boot bag on a seat next to them or a seat nearby. Bus seats are for people participating on the trips.
- All bus seats are to be available to any trip participant. Seats are available on a first come, first served basis. If any participant is traveling by him or herself, it is not permitted by any means to prevent any other participant to sit in the empty seat next to them. If you are traveling with a partner, the companion seat may be “saved” until the partner arrives. .
- Personal items (snacks/food, coolers, clothing items) are permitted on the bus as long as they can be safely stowed under the participants own seat or in the overhead compartment above their seat. The club may provide beverages and snacks depending on the trip destination and length.
- If the trip leader indicates that there is space available, boots in boot bags may be placed in the area of the rearmost seat of the bus or a location determined by the trip leader, stacked on the seat and floor to accommodate all who wish to take advantage of this offer.
- The Trip Leader is in charge and all decisions relating to changes during the trip made necessary by weather, injury or unexpected circumstances are his/hers to make.
- Trip Leaders, Trip Committee members, and Officers of the Club and Board members are empowered to enforce these rules on any club bus trip regardless of the destination, location or length of trip.

Everyone wants to have an enjoyable ski trip and let's face it, the bus ride is the price we pay for fun on the slopes. Here are some tips that can make any bus trip more enjoyable.

1 Arrive at the loading location with plenty of time to spare. The bus leaves promptly at the announced departure time. Even if you are only 5 minutes late, you will find that the bus has left without you.

2 Have your skis in a ski bag. If it's an overnight trip, bring the smallest suitcase you can manage. When loading equipment and baggage, place your skis in one compartment under the bus and your luggage in a separate compartment. If the bus is going directly to the ski resort, you may wish to carry your boots on the bus to keep them warm. Stash them under your seat (never in the overhead bin). You may also want to take a very small "gym" bag for your gloves, goggles, hat, etc. that you can place in the overhead bin. On a long trip, a small pillow and blanket may be a welcome addition. Remember though, it's a catch-22 situation -- the more comforts you bring, the less room you have to be comfortable.

3 On the bus, introduce yourself to those sitting around you. Make new friends. If you've brought your favorite chocolate-chip cookies, why not share them with those around you?

4 The Club usually provides some cold beverages on the bus. However, if you must have your morning cup of java, why not bring a small thermos of your favorite blend? Early morning bus trips generally do not stop on their way to the ski resort, so plan on bringing your own snack or having breakfast at the resort.

5 Once we arrive at the resort, the trip leader will proceed to the office to obtain lift tickets for everyone. Your job is to stay put! Do not disembark the bus until the trip leader returns with the lift tickets. While we're waiting for the trip leader to return, it is helpful if 5 or 6 people begin to unload skis. Don't be bashful about volunteering.

The faster we unload equipment, the quicker you can hit the slopes. Before you leave the bus, the trip leader will announce the departure time and whether or not the bus will make a dinner stop on the way home. Again, the bus will depart at the announced time whether you are on it or not.

6 Never, ever wear your ski boots on the bus. The buckles can scrape and rip the seats. When you take your skis out of the bag, place the bag in a convenient place where you can find it later and where it won't be buried by skis or other bags if you are not the first one back to the bus at the end of the day. You may wish to carry your ski bag and boots to the lodge, where you can rent a locker for the day.

7 Take with you whatever you may need for the day. Are you taking medication or need spare eyeglasses? Don't leave them on the bus. The bus may be moved, or locked during the day and it will be inaccessible. Remember our driver was driving all night while you were sleeping and he needs to rest while you're skiing.

8 When you return to the bus at the end of the day, return your skis to their ski bag and place them on the bus. Please don't bury someone's empty ski bag; it's no fun to dig it out. The beverage container will be restocked and munchies will be passed around. Just sit back, relax, and enjoy the ride home. Usually an action-packed video will make the return trip go quickly.

9 As we approach home, be prepared with a couple of dollar bills if the trip leader comes around requesting a tip for the bus driver. Sometimes the tip is included in the price of the trip; sometimes it's not. Hasn't it been great leaving the driving to someone else?

10 Back in the parking lot, everyone wants to find their stuff as soon as possible so they can go home. First, though, take the time to clean up the area where you were sitting. Please don't leave any trash at your seat and double check to make sure you've taken everything off the bus that you brought with you. Thank the bus driver. Also, make sure you take YOUR skis and YOUR luggage. No one wants to get home and find they have someone else's dirty underwear. Drive home safely! And join us again for another great road trip.

Trip Agreement & Application

The undersigned participant applies to participate in the Stark County Ski Club (SCSC) trip described below, subject to the following conditions:


1. **Payments:** Trip deposits will vary trip to trip. The required deposit for this trip is \$_____, and must be paid and submitted along with this signed "Trip Agreement and Application". Balance shall be due & payable in accordance with payment schedules established by SCSC & described in the trip description in "Tips & Tails", the club newsletter, or on the club website, www.starkcountyskiclub.org. Charges may be added for supplemental costs such as fuel surcharges, taxes and airport departure changes to the price of the trip. All payment checks shall be payable to "Stark County Ski Club" & sent to trip leader noted.
2. **Withdrawal & Change:** Stark County Ski Club may withdraw any trip from its schedule at any time; may refuse to accept or refrain any person as a participant at any time for any reason; and may change the itinerary at any time.
3. **Responsibility:** SCSC is acting gratuitously for the applicant and shall not be responsible or liable for any loss of or damage to any baggage, property, or for any loss, injury, death, accident, delay, inconvenience or any other loss occurring during or occasioned by an applicant's participation in any trip, and as a result of any actual or alleged negligence of SCSC or any SCSC member or officer.
4. **Identification:** Participants are responsible for any required identification for travel. This may include, but not limited to, an up to date and valid passport, visa, drivers license or proof of identification and citizenship.
5. **Minors:** Any minor's participant's "Trip Application & Agreement" must be co-signed by his/her parent or legal guardian. The minor must be accompanied on the trip by a parent or legal guardian or their designee who shall be wholly and fully responsible for said minor's conduct and well being.
6. **Cancellation & Refunds:**
 - A). Cancellation by participant means & includes: failure to abide by terms of this agreement, notice of intent to cancel; failure to make timely payments; failure for any reason to meet the departure or return of the trip.
 - B). When TSC cancels or withdraws a trip, the participant shall be entitled to a full refund unless such cancellation or withdrawal is necessitated or caused, in whole or part, by participant's cancellation or failure to make timely payments.
 - C). Where participant cancels more than 30 days before departure of a 1-day or multi-day trip or more than 60 days before the departure of a longer trip, then participant shall be responsible for a cancellation service charge of not less than \$10.00 & any fees charged by an airline if seats have already been ticketed.
 - D). Where participant cancels less than 30 days before the departure of a 1-day or multi-day trip or less than 60 days before the departure of a longer trip and where the trip departs full or where participant provides an immediate replacement who completes this agreement, then participant shall receive a full refund less the cancellation service charge & any fees accessed because of the name change. If the trip departs unfilled and the participant has not provided a replacement, then the participant may be entitled to a partial refund less any amounts pre-paid by SCSC for participant's unused transportation, lodging, meals, lifts or amenities and less the cancellation service charge. If the applicant cancels and the trip departs unfilled, the applicant will be refunded the amount of any un-purchased lift tickets. Transportation, lodging and other special costs may NOT be refunded. Specific trip circumstances will determine if any refund of these costs are possible. In any case, the participant is responsible to SCSC for any amounts paid out by SCSC over and above payments made by participant. Any pre-paid expenses that are not refunded to the club by the airlines, resorts, etc. are not subject to be refunded to participant. For 1-week or longer trips, it is advised to purchase trip insurance for refunds. SCSC may modify or change balance due dates & cancellation deadlines to accommodate its payments to airlines, lodges, bus companies and travel agents.
7. **Eligibility:** Participation in this trip is first available to SCSC & CSMS members. Any non-members must pay an additional charge of not less than \$10.00 and is designated within the trip description.


