Highlights of the SCSC August Socials





Stark County Ski Club is investigating a trip to Stowe, Vermont

December 11-15, 2014, Thursday-Sunday, returning early Monday AM.

Includes: Transportation to Amtrak Cleveland, Amtrak train (Lakeshore Limited) to Schenectady, NY, motor coach to Stowe, VT. Lodging at Commodore Hotel in Stowe, 2 per room, breakfast daily, one group dinner at Commodore, 3 days lifts at Stowe (or option of one day at Jay Peak, depending on number of people interested, at a cost of \$15 additional), and return to Canton, Ohio. Train baggage and bus tips included. Hotel is close to quaint, historic, downtown Stowe. It's an easy walk to other restaurants, shops, and places of interest. We will have our bus with us for the duration so we can explore as we wish.

We will have time in Schenectady both going and coming home to have food and libation. There are several options near the train depot. No need to rush a meal at Stowe prior to departure. You can ski a little longer, then rush to the bus.

We would be traveling Thursday and Sunday evening; skiing Fri-Sat-Sun.

Rate: Depends on number of people committed.



Whitefish, Montana

February 7 through 14 or 15, 2015



Round trip to Whitefish for lodging at the Lodge at Whitefish Lake.

Package includes breakfast daily, Welcome Party, 5 days of skiing at the mountain. Plans and pricing will differ based on means of transportation to Whitefish, Montana. Choose either plane transportation from Cleveland Airport to Kalispell, MT. and bus transfer to the Lodge or train transportation and all shuttles necessary for your trip. Plane travel is Saturday/Saturday to get you there and back quicker for those pressed for time. Train departs Saturday arrives Sunday and returns following Saturday PM with an arrival in Cleveland early AM Monday, the 16th. Train trip features coach to Chicago, sleeper units to Whitefish, 7 meals and 2 night's lodging while onboard, bar/observation car opportunities and some great scenery along the way. All taxes and tips are included for the basic trips.

At the Lodge at Whitefish Lake, in the Viking Lodge building, will be hotel rooms, 2 people per room. The Lodge will provide free shuttles to the mountain and to town by request. A new heated indoor pool and hot tub, plus the outdoor hot tub will be open for our trip. You will get a 10% discount at the on-sight, full service spa to soothe those aching muscles. Sunday, February 22, 2015-You MUST be at Faircrest Steel Plant parking lot no later than 3:15AM

3:30AM- Thomas Limo shuttle departure for Cleveland Amtrak Station

4:30AM-arrive at Cleveland Amtrak station and prepare luggage for group check-in; must have "group" tags!

5:50AM-depart Cleveland for Schenectady, NY; breakfast and lunch are available on the train in the dining car.

2:00PM-Arrive in Schenectady, NY; transfer luggage to Wade Tours coach; skis, boot bags and luggage each in separate bays.

2:30PM-Lunch at Katie O'Byrne's Pub or other nearby restaurants. **4:00PM**-depart via Wade Tours for Ludlow, Vermont

6:00PM-arrive at Point Hotel, Ludlow, VT for check-in. Use the hot tub or enjoy the hotel lounge for cocktails, dinner or snacks.

Monday, February 23, 2015

6:30-8:00AM-breakfast @ Point Hotel-**8:30AM**-load coach for ride to Okemo Mountain Ski Area

9:00AM-arrive at Okemo Mtn. Ski passes distributed. On your own for skiing until 4:30PM.

4:45PM-depart Okemo for Point Hotel. **5:00PM** arrive back at our hotel

7:00PM Welcome Party in the lounge at the Point, then dinner on your own at our hotel or nearby options. (more info later!)

Tuesday, February 24:

6:30-8:00AM-breakfast at our hotel.

8:30AM-depart for Okemo Mountain and full day of skiing. **4:30PM**-load our bus for departure to Mt. Snow.

6PM-arrive at Snow Flake Lodge, Mt. Snow, VT. Dinner on your own at lodge or nearby options.

Wednesday, February 25:

6:30-8:00AM Breakfast at Snow Flake Lodge; after breakfast, resort shuttle will take you to Base 3 at Mt. Snow or ride our bus.

Slopes open at 9:00AM. You are close enough to the ski area to decide your own start for skiing and end of skiing.

Wednesday evening-on your own, if you wish or we may organize a visit to some local dining/entertainment spots.

Thursday, February 26, 2015

6:30-8:00AM-Breakfast at Snow Flake Lodge; after breakfast, prepare for check-out. You can check out prior to heading to the slopes, load your luggage on our bus and then head to the slopes or come back to Lodge to check out before **11AM** and load your gear on our bus. Skiing is on your schedule, BUT, be back at the Snow Flake Lodge by **3:30PM** to load our bus for departure.

3:45PM-depart for Schenectady and our train ride to Cleveland

5:15PM-arrive at train station. Dine at any of the nearby establishments that strike your fancy.

Be back at station by **6:45PM** to check-in with Amtrak.

7:31PM- train departs for Cleveland

Friday, February 27, 2015: 3:27AM-arrive in Cleveland **3:45AM**-load Thomas Limo bus for departure to Canton

4:45AM- arrive at Faircrest Steel plant, unload bus and head home!

Trip Agreement & Application

The undersigned participant applies to participate in the Stark County Ski Club (SCSC) trip described below, subject to the following conditions:

1. **Payments:** Trip deposits will vary trip to trip. The required deposit for this trip is \$ _____, and must be paid and submitted along with this signed "Trip Agreement and Application". Balance shall be due & payable in accordance with payment schedules established by SCSC & described in the trip description in the club newsletter, www.Starkcountyskiclub.org, or www.Facebook.com/StarkCountySkiClub. Charges may be added for supplemental costs such as fuel surcharges, taxes and airport departure changes to the price of the trip. All payment checks shall be payable to "Stark County Ski Club" & sent to trip leader noted.
2. **Withdrawal & Change:** Stark County Ski Club may withdraw any trip from its schedule at any time; may refuse to accept or refrain any person as a participant at any time for any reason; and may change the itinerary at any time.
3. **Responsibility:** SCSC is acting gratuitously for the applicant and shall not be responsible or liable for any loss of or damage to baggage, property, or for any loss, injury, death, accident, delay, inconvenience or any other loss occurring during or occasioned by applicant's participation in any trip, and as a result of any actual or alleged negligence of SCSC or any SCSC member or officer.
4. **Identification:** Participants are responsible for any required identification for travel. This may include, but not limited to, an up to date and valid passport, visa, drivers license or proof of identification and citizenship.
5. **Minors:** Any minor's participant's "Trip Application & Agreement" must be co-signed by his/her parent or legal guardian. The minor must be accompanied on the trip by a parent or legal guardian or their designee who shall be wholly and fully responsible for said minor's conduct and well being.
6. **Cancellation & Refunds:**
 - A). Cancellation by participant means & includes: failure to abide by terms of this agreement, notice of intent to cancel; failure to make timely payments; failure for any reason to meet the departure or return of the trip.
 - B). When SCSC cancels or withdraws a trip, the participant shall be entitled to a full refund unless such cancellation or withdrawal is necessitated or caused, in whole or part, by participant's cancellation or failure to make timely payments.
 - C). Where participant cancels more than 30 days before departure of a 1-day or multi-day trip or more than 60 days before the departure of a longer trip, then participant shall be responsible for a cancellation service charge of not less than \$10.00 & any fees charged by an airline if seats have already been ticketed.
 - D). Where participant cancels less than 30 days before the departure of a 1-day or multi-day trip or less than 60 days before the departure of a longer trip and where the trip departs full or where participant provides an immediate replacement who completes this agreement, then participant shall receive a full refund less the cancellation service charge & any fees accessed because of the name change. If the trip departs unfilled and the participant has not provided a replacement, then the participant may be entitled to a partial refund less any amounts pre-paid by SCSC for participant's unused transportation, lodging, meals, lifts or amenities and less the cancellation service charge. If the applicant cancels and the trip departs unfilled, the applicant will be refunded the amount of any un-purchased lift tickets. Transportation, lodging and other special costs may NOT be refunded. Specific trip circumstances will determine if any refund of these costs are possible. In any case, the participant is responsible to SCSC for any amounts paid out by SCSC over and above payments made by participant. Any pre-paid expenses that are not refunded to the club by the airlines, resorts, etc. are not subject to be refunded to participant. For 1-week or longer trips, it is advised to purchase trip insurance for refunds. SCSC may modify or change balance due dates & cancellation deadlines to accommodate its payments to airlines, lodges, bus companies and travel agents.
7. **Eligibility:** Participation in this trip is first available to SCSC & CSMS members. Any non-members must pay an additional charge of not less than \$10.00 & is designated within the trip description.
