We need a merchandise manager too. The job's to order, pick-up, tote, sell, and collect money for our club logo-ed merchandise. It's not difficult. We have a great local company doing our embroider work and PRW, owned by our club member, does all of our silk screen items. We'd like to find a marketing manager. The job there is to be the PR person who finds ways to promote our club in the community and local skiing area. Think about it! We need your help.

We will be offering the opportunity to purchase already available club merchandise at the April and May meetings. And, we will be offering the chance to order club polo shirts for the warm season. Get your club gear now!

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by President, Jim Kovach, at 7:10 p.m. Forty-two (42) individuals were in attendance. Jim welcomed everyone to the meeting and we had two new members/guests, Mike and Pam, introduce themselves. Jim called for the following reports:

Reports:

President's Report: Jim Kovach recognized Tom and Beth Sinacore and Gary Johnson for their volunteer work with Three Trackers. Jim also thanked Donna Brancifort for all her hard work in keeping track of early discount vouchers and all that goes into her detailed spreadsheet.

Vice President's Report: Jason Stephan reported he is still waiting on training dates for Blossom. First year workers will need to re-certify as well as anyone who has not yet TEAM trained and would like to help the club keep costs down on trips by working concerts.

Treasurer's Report: Donna Brancifort reported on the treasury balance. Donna noted that out of the \$7,000 earned last year at Blossom, over \$6,000 was used on the early discount vouchers and worker certificates. There was still \$5,000 Blossom money carried over from the year before.

Secretary's Report: Jennie Stephan reported the current amount of 50/50 raffle (\$145) and the additional items available to win from the raffle ticket sales were mentioned.

Social Report: Diane Marzec reported that they had an all-time high turnout at Perennial in February with 40 attending. The next social on the calendar is March 23 at Geisen Haus starting at 5:30 pm. Euchre night is April 16 at the Brancifort's. There is one opening and potential for more room to be made. Let Diane know if you are interested. The cost is \$3pp to play; bring a dish to share and your own beverages. You are welcome to come socialize if you miss out on a spot or don't want to play. Diane plans to purchase tickets for Gervasi's Piazza opening when they become available and will post the date and availability on those tickets. Summer events include, camping at Mohican July 15-17; Tim McGraw Concert August 5 (you can come for the pre-concert party if you missed out on tickets); Rafting/Camping in WVA offering both the New River or Upper Gauley depending on your expertise/desire to raft one or the other. Let Diane know if you have an idea for a social – wine making is being discussed.

Website and Facebook Report: Gary Johnson reported he posted pictures from the Seven Springs trip and there were 300+ people looking at our page. Jim Kovach commented that we picked up two new members from the website so it is good to keep it updated with pictures from our many activities.

Trip Committee Report: Art Pokopac asked for the last trip reports of the season:

Holiday Valley Casino Feb 27/28. Mike Lockhart reported that 42 went and had fun skiing and enjoying the sunny weekend.

Banff, Alberta, Canada Mar 5-12 Al Brancifort reported 33 traveled to Banff and there were no injuries despite a major power outage that did cause one of our members to be stuck on a lift. The early arrival on Saturday left extra time for sightseeing or skiing. Al also noted that members used \$700 in discount vouchers on the trip.

Holiday Valley, March 19 Fred Scherer reported that due to warm weather, the trip was canceled.

New Business

Elections: Officer nominations will also be accepted prior to elections at the April meeting. Jim Kovach read from the Club Constitution regarding the officer positions and relayed that, generally, there are a couple Executive Committee meetings and one Board meeting throughout the year. Current officers, excluding Jim Kovach who has reached his term limit as President, are willing to stay in their positions. Donna Brancifort stated if someone is interested in being Treasurer, she would be willing to help them learn. If you have a desire for any office you may put your name in at the April meeting but we do need a candidate for President. We would also like a Merchandise person.

HOF Marathon: The Hof of Fame Marathon, which will have events happening April 22-24, has expressed a need for volunteers. There is an expo on Friday, a kid's race Saturday or manning a water station on Sunday. We are considering helping and Donna Brancifort will have more information on later and you can contact her if you are interested in helping on any of those dates.



Trip Agreement & Application

The undersigned participant applies to participate in the Stark County Ski Club (SCSC) trip described below, subject to the following conditions:

1. **Payments:** Trip deposits will vary per trip and must be paid and submitted along with this signed "Trip Agreement and Application" (below). Balance shall be due & payable in accordance with payment schedules established by SCSC & described in the trip description in "Tips & Tails", the club newsletter, or on the club website www.starkcountyskiclub.org. Charges may be added for supplemental costs such as fuel surcharges, taxes and airport departure changes to the price of the trip. All payment checks shall be payable to "Stark County Ski Club" & sent to trip leader noted.
2. **Withdrawal & Change:** Stark County Ski Club may withdraw any trip from its schedule at any time; may refuse to accept or refrain any person as a participant at any time for any reason; and may change the itinerary at any time.
3. **Responsibility:** SCSC is acting gratuitously for the applicant and shall not be responsible or liable for any loss of or damage to any baggage, property, or for any loss, injury, death, accident, delay, inconvenience or any other loss occurring during or occasioned by an applicant's participation in any trip, and as a result of any actual or alleged negligence of SCSC or any SCSC member or officer.
4. **Identification:** Participants are responsible for any required identification for travel. This may include, but not limited to, an up to date and valid passport, visa, drivers license or proof of identification and citizenship.
5. **Minors:** Any minor's participant's "Trip Application & Agreement" must be co-signed by his/her parent or legal guardian. The minor must be accompanied on the trip by a parent or legal guardian or their designee who shall be wholly and fully responsible for said minor's conduct and well being.
6. **Cancellation & Refunds:**
 - A). Cancellation by participant means & includes: failure to abide by terms of this agreement, notice of intent to cancel; failure to make timely payments; failure for any reason to meet the departure or return of the trip.
 - B). When SCSC cancels or withdraws a trip, the participant shall be entitled to a full refund unless such cancellation or withdrawal is necessitated or caused, in whole or part, by participant's cancellation or failure to make timely payments.
 - C). Where participant cancels more than 30 days before departure of a 1-day or multi-day trip or more than 60 days before the departure of a longer trip, then participant shall be responsible for a cancellation service charge of not less than \$10.00 & any fees charged by an airline if seats have already been ticketed.
 - D). Where participant cancels less than 30 days before the departure of a 1-day or multi-day trip or less than 60 days before the departure of a longer trip and where the trip departs full or where participant provides an immediate replacement who completes this agreement, then participant shall receive a full refund less the cancellation service charge & any fees accessed because of the name change. If the trip departs unfilled and the participant has not provided a replacement, then the participant may be entitled to a partial refund less any amounts pre-paid by SCSC for participant's unused transportation, lodging, meals, lifts or amenities and less the cancellation service charge. If the applicant cancels and the trip departs unfilled, the applicant will be refunded the amount of any un-purchased lift tickets. Transportation, lodging and other special costs may NOT be refunded. Specific trip circumstances will determine if any refund of these costs are possible. In any case, the participant is responsible to SCSC for any amounts paid out by SCSC over and above payments made by participant. Any pre-paid expenses that are not refunded to the club by the airlines, resorts, etc. are not subject to be refunded to participant. For 1-week or longer trips, it is advised to purchase trip insurance for refunds. SCSC may modify or change balance due dates & cancellation deadlines to accommodate its payments to airlines, lodges, bus companies and travel agents.
7. **Eligibility:** Participation in this trip is first available to SCSC & CSMS members. Any non-members must pay an additional charge of not less than \$10.00 and is designated within the trip description.
