Please read the remainder of the newsletter for upcoming socials & the details of the ski season.



Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by President Donna Brancifort at 7:15 p.m. Donna thanked everyone for coming to the first meeting of the season and asked visitors and newer members to introduce themselves. Fifty-one (51) individuals were in attendance.

Officer Reports

President's Report: Donna Brancifort reported first of sadder news, and gave an update on Jim Shear's condition. He is resting at Sharyn Kitzmiller's home with the aid of hospice. They thank everyone for cards, visits and their support. Donna then shared that CMSC member, Shelli Snyder, has been injured in a serious accident and asked that Gail give the report on that information and on her condition. Jim Kovach moved that the club donate \$100 to Shelli's GoFundMe account that has been set up to help with medical and family's expenses. Donna continued on with her report and said the club bought an ad in the Three Trackers program for their Night at the Races, which will be held October 8. Donna also reported the Executive and Trip Committees met during the summer. The 2016/17 season is set so the Trip Committee is looking at 2018. The Executive Committee met and the main topic was changes to the Club Constitution which will be covered under new business.

Vice President's Report: Dave Hershey was absent and Donna reported the Oktoberfest Party will be held at Jim and Zee's house on October 2. Please RSVP to Dave ASAP at prodrumstudio33@gmail.com because this is being catered and we need an accurate head count for food. There is a cost of \$7 for member, \$4 for child and \$10 for non-member guests. Bring your own alcoholic beverages; ice tea and water will be provided. There will be a chili cook off if your wish to participate; as well as games and prizes.

Treasurer's Report: Zee Kovach reported on the amount currently in the club treasury. She noted that money is coming in with memberships and going out for deposits on resorts and buses.

Facebook Report: Gary Johnson reported the best way to get interest in the club on Facebook is to Like and Share our page. He noted that tonight's meeting notice had 140 people see it. Gary is also active with Three Trackers and reported that the Night at the Races is a fun evening and the cost is \$35 per person which includes food and drink.

Blossom Report: Jason Stephan was absent but it was discussed that Blossom may have run its course and if there are other opportunities closer to Stark County to pursue for fundraising. Donna and Gail are looking into HOF Village, and Clays Park to name a few. Donna, Zee, Jason and Gail will meet to divvy up credit card tips as best they can to the people who worked the concerts where they were given. Vouchers for the workers should be ready by the October meeting so they can be used towards trips.

Merchandise: Jim Kovach reported he has some of last years' merchandise available and he will have more at the October meeting. There are catalogs to look at and it will be mostly by order for items such as turtlenecks, fleece jackets, pullovers, vests. Talk to Jim if you have any questions.

Marketing: Gail Vogt reported on several marketing events. Upcoming is the Boston Mills Open House the weekend of Oct 14-16. Volunteers are needed to man the club table. If you are interested in helping clean up the Towpath there is the opportunity in Bolivar on October 15. This gets the club good P.R. Recently we have volunteered at Marathon's and 5K's manning water stations. The date for Winter Fest has not been confirmed yet. If you hear of an event that sounds like a good fit for the club, let Gail know and she will look into it.

Membership: Debbie Scherer reported membership forms and money are due by October 31. Please remember to send your money with your form.

Newsletter Report: Mike Bishop reported that earlier is always better. Get your newsletter submissions to him by the Friday after the meeting.

Social Chair Report: Diane Marzec reported there was a recent social at Table Six with approximately 25 people attending to discuss the upcoming W Va. camping and white water rafting trip. 41 people are going and there are many other activities such as bridge walking, hiking, golfing, biking, etc. Upcoming socials will be tied into ski events such as Oktoberfest on October 2nd and the Ski Shack's Open House on October 22. In November watch for Winter Fest at Quaker Steak and Lube.

New Business

Constitution: The Executive Committee met recently to hash out some changes they felt are needed. There are some additions to officer duties, changes to the trip committee, updates on trip discount vouchers and non-monetary compensation. These changes were handed out in paper form at the meeting and will be made available and discussed again at the Oktoberfest before coming up for a vote at the October 18th meeting.

"Blood Money": Jim Kovach discussed how the Club has provided door prizes over the years. Donors, (Jim is a major one, as well as Dwight and Jason in the past) have given platelets and blood at Aultman locations and credit has gone to the club and we have turned that reimbursement into gift cards and certificates for Ski Shack, Quaker Steak and Lube and Mulligan's, to name a few. Aultman has stopped that program and replaced it with a new program with not as great of an incentive. Jim has voiced his concerns and he hopes they will work to improve the new program. Last year the club earned \$1,500 from this program and Jim guesimates over \$4,000 in the past six years.

Snow Trails: John Masalko presented season pass information. The Super Flex Pass (1 day/week) is \$165 and a Season Pass is \$235 through October 15. Rates go up the longer you wait. Group Code – M37-Stark County Ski Club, Seasonal Club Promotional Code – SeasonalClubs1617.





Constitution proposed changes

The executive committee of the Stark County Ski Club is proposing changes to our Constitution. In the pages 9-12, under Article IV, Government and in Section C, Duties of Officers, you will find the proposed changes and insertions in **RED** font. In **BLUE** font, you will find the passages the we would propose to delete.

Our purpose is three-fold. One is to change the compensation schedule basis to the dollar amount of total paid memberships in the club rather than just a numerical figure of total member enrollment. We believe this is a more sensible position than the previous method. On the second part, we propose eliminating free membership for all but the President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary and Past-President (the Executive Committee) thereby increasing our membership income. This simplifies the process for the Membership Coordinator. In the third part, we are proposing a slight increase in compensation credit for Board of Director positions and for the officers, as well as adding a Merchandise Manager, Marketing Manager, and Social Events Manager positions to the compensation credit list.

In the past several years, our membership dollars greatly exceeded the expense of compensation credit. We believe that will continue to be the case for years to come.

These proposed changes will be discussed with the membership at the October meeting. After discussion, we will vote whether to accept those changes. The Executive Committee welcomes your comments.

Section C-2 (Vice President):

- (i) The Vice President's duties are to include but not be limited to:
 - a. Assisting the President in carrying out the duties of the office of President
 - b. Presiding at General Meetings in the absence of the President
 - c. Acts as the publicity chairperson for the *Club* and coordinates with the Marketing and Merchandise managers to promote the Club in as many ways as possible
 - d. Generally promotes the name and goodwill of the *Club*
 - e. Should the President be unable due to absence or calamity, unwilling because of personal reasons or preferences, the Vice President shall be authorized to sign binding contracts in the best interests of the *Club* as determined by a vote of the Executive Board
 - f. In the event of the resignation, death, severe illness, or revocation of the current President's membership by the Board, the Vice President shall become "acting President" until such time as an elections can be held to elect a new President and any other officer should an office be vacated by the election of the new President. This special election will be held at the next scheduled *Club* meeting
 - g. Represents the *Club* at Cleveland Metro Ski Council (CMSC) meetings

Section C-3 (Secretary):

- (i) The Secretary's duties are to include but not be limited to:
 - a. Recording/preparing the minutes of all Board and General Business meetings
 - b. Keeping the Constitution and all official records of the *Club*
 - c. Advising the *Ex. Comm.* and members of any acts in conflict with the Constitution and Supervises the Newsletter distribution
 - d. Preparing letters for general *Club* business and maintains a file of important correspondence
 - e. Presiding at General Meetings in the absence of both the President and Vice President
 - f. Maintains all past trip documents and minutes files.
 - g. Sends sympathy, birthday, get well and other appropriate cards to members as deemed necessary.

Section C-4 (Treasurer):

- (i) The Treasurer's duties are to include but not be limited to:
 - a. Accounting for accurate and current financial records
 - b. Reconciling of the *Club* bank statement monthly
 - c. Receiving monies from membership and committee chairs paid to the *Club* for participation in activities
 - d. Depositing all funds received and handles all transactions related thereto
 - e. Preparing monthly reports of receipts and expenditures
 - f. Keeping all financial records and maintaining an inventory of all *Club* financial property for a minimum of seven (7) years.
 - g. In a timely manner, preparing and filing all required Federal, State, local tax and information returns

- (ii) The President may appoint *Club* member(s) or an organization to audit the Treasurer's records and other *Club* accounts at least once per year. The Treasurer shall cooperate with this audit.

- (iii) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary the past or departing Treasurer continues as Treasurer during the appropriate transition period.
 - a. The past Treasurer will coordinate the new bank signature card and mailing address change.
 - b. There should be three check signers from amongst the Officers, two of them must be the Treasurer and the President.

Section C-5 (Combinations):

Officers may not hold more than one office at the same time. Officers, including the President and Vice President, may hold the same office in consecutive terms. The President and Vice President offices are limited to two consecutive terms.

Section D: Trip/Activity Committee

- (i) The Trip Committee shall consist of 5 members: a Trip Chairperson and 4 other Club members, each in good standing.
- (ii) Elections for the Trip Committee members shall occur at the regularly scheduled meeting in November each year. All Club members present at that meeting may vote.
- (iii) Votes will be tallied by the Election Committee, Club Officers, or delegates. The candidate receiving the most votes will be designated the Trip Chairperson. The candidates receiving the four next highest numbers of votes shall be designated as members of the Committee.
- (iv) Trip Committee Chairpersons term shall be 2 years. All other committee member terms are for one year. A person may be Chairperson more than once, just not consecutive terms.
- (v) (The President and Vice President) All current officers and the past-president are *defacto* members of the committee for input, aid with decision making, and tie-breaking purposes. Other officers are eligible to run for position on the committee.
- (vi) Duties of the Trip Committee are to plan, budget, and schedule trips and activities in the best interests of the Club. The Executive Committee must approve all trips planned by the Trip Committee prior to scheduling or contracting any services.
- (vii) The Trip Committee has first option to lead all trips. They shall seek volunteers, draft or delegate club members, including officers, to run any trips they choose not to run themselves.

Section E: Indemnification

Section E-1 (Coverage):

No Officers, Directors, Committee Chairpersons, Trip/Activity Leaders or other members of the *Club* will be personally or otherwise liable for their duly authorized actions or omissions when acting on or in behalf of the Stark County Ski Club.

Section F: Distribution of Assets

Section F-1 (Liquidation):

- (i) In the event of dissolution of the Stark County Ski Club, liquidation of assets and distribution of any funds remaining in the treasury shall be made as follows:
 - a. Elimination of Outstanding Debt: All outstanding debts owed to any/all legitimate creditors shall be paid from the funds remaining in the *Club* treasury.
 - b. Liquidation of Physical Assets: All physical assets shall be collected and auctioned off during a regularly scheduled or special called meeting for the purpose of disposing of the same. Proceeds from such auction shall be deposited into the *Club* treasury. Any items not sold shall be donated to the Goodwill Industries or similar charity organization.
 - c. Liquidation of Liquid Assets: On dissolution, the assets of the *Club* shall be distributed to one or more regularly organized, qualified charity organizations(s) to be selected by the *Board*. The charitable organization should meet the criteria of a charitable entity as defined by the Internal Revenue Code.

Section G: Compensation/Trip Discount Vouchers

- (i) To encourage Club members to be active and participate in the government of the Club, members shall be compensated according to the following schedule:
 - a. President \$500 credit towards trips and activities of the Club during their term and free membership during her/his term and for the next 2 years as Past President.
 - b. Vice President \$400 credit towards trip and activities of the Club during her/his term and free membership for that term.
 - c. Treasurer \$400 credit towards trips and activities of the Club during her/his term and free membership during that term.
 - d. Secretary \$300 credit towards trips and activities of the Club during her/his term and free membership for that term.
 - e. Trip Chairperson \$125 credit to be used for Club activities or merchandise. And, the opportunity to participate in the Mountain Travel Symposium and "FAM" trips, with or without full or partial reimbursement by the Club.
 - f. Trip Committee \$75 credit to be used for club activities or merchandise.
 - g. Webmaster \$125 credit to be used for Club activities or merchandise.
 - h. Newsletter Editor \$125 credit to be used for Club activities or merchandise.
 - i. Membership Chair \$125 credit to be used for Club activities or merchandise
 - j. Marketing Manager \$125 credit to be used for Club activities or merchandise

- k. Social Events Manager - \$125 credit to be used for Club activities or merchandise
- l. Merchandise Manager- \$125 credit to be used for Club activities or merchandise.
- m. Any additional appointees as determined by the President or the Board (e.g. Parliamentarian, Financial or Legal Advisor, Facebook Manager, Biking Manager, Merchandise Manager, Social Events Coordinator) shall receive one year of free Club membership. \$50 credit to be used towards club activities or merchandise.
- n. Trip/Activity Leaders:
 - One day trip leaders will be fully compensated for the cost of trip; lifts, transportation and any travel fees. **Their trip is free.**
 - Multi-day trip leaders (at least 2 days of skiing) will receive \$150 credit to be used toward club activities or merchandise. Per/bus to be reimbursed after trip is completed.
 - Week trip leaders will receive a credit in amount equal to free lift tickets for the number of days skiing the trip has assigned. Minimum amount will be \$300. Reimbursement will occur after the trip is completed.

(ii) Maximum compensation any member may receive for the season is \$500. If any officer runs a trip and would be entitled to a trip leader's compensation, the maximum total credit they could receive is \$500.

(iii) No cash compensation will be paid to officers or trip leaders. At the end of the *Club* season, any unused compensation credit will be forfeited.

(iv) Monetary compensations listed above are valid as long as active membership total remains at 190 or above. Should the membership total decline to less than 190 but more than 120, compensation shall be at 75% of the above numbers. Should the membership total decline to 120 or less, compensation shall be at 50% of the above numbers.

Compensation or credits listed above are valid as long as they do not exceed the total amount of income from Club memberships in the given fiscal year. Should the membership income decline to less than the compensation outlay, the compensation formulae shall be changed so as to not exceed said income. The new compensation formulae shall be determined by the Executive Board and approved by the Board of Directors and the General Membership.
