Call to Order

President Jason Stephan called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. He welcomed everyone and asked those new to the meetings to introduce themselves. Deb, who was checking out the club and Russell, who came as a guest, were two new attendees. Forty-two (42) individuals were present. Jason called for the following reports:

Officer Reports

President Report: Jason Stephan reported that the Newsletter Editor is doing well after surgery and even plans to ski next year. Jason noted that it's been a challenging winter once again.

Vice President Report: Jeri Johnson was absent.

Treasurer Report: Melba Gasque reported on the current treasury amount.

Secretary Report: Jennie Stephan reported she had sold \$170 in the 50/50 raffle.

Membership Report: Roberta Graham reported there had been no changes since last month.

Social Chair Report: Vickie Roe reported that 5 people participated in Glow Tubing at Snow Trails. Vickie was not at the Perennial gathering or comedy show to give a report. Vickie reported the annual Euchre tournament is April 6 at the Brancifort's and there are 6 spots open, RSVP to Vickie. Others are welcome to come socialize. They will also schedule a winery bus for the summer.

Merchandise Report: Gail Vogt reported that 1/4 zip pullovers are \$20 and everything else is discounted to sell at \$5. Going forward, everyone can purchase their own merchandise and it can be taken to the embroiderer for personalization. Gail noted that she will keep an eye out for clearance deals at JCPenney's.

Old Business

Constitution: Jason Stephan stated that the Executive Committee looked through communications, notes and minutes due to an error of omission that was made when the constitutional amendment regarding membership dues was voted on and approved. The website reflects the updated, correct version of the constitution.

New Business

Sports for Sound: The Club will be making a charitable donation to Sports for Sound and would also like to provide volunteers for their fundraising event on May 18. Kris Schnell gave information on the obstacle course challenges and festivities of the day. Ross Mtn BBQ and Lockport Brewery will be present. Kris noted the cost of hearing aids is expensive and there is a need for assistance in the communities that Sports for Sound helps provide. For more information google Sport for Sound.

CSMS: Fred Scherer stated that as the second largest club in CMSC, he feels CMSC doesn't respect our club or give us much back for our membership dues. Al Brancifort supported Fred's position and stated the leadership of the CMSC clubs are geared towards racing. Jason and Gail acknowledged that Fred and Al's concerns are valid but there is still much to consider what we would lose, such as networking, advertising, etc. if we pull out of CMSC. Gail has talked to the current President, Bootsie Ricketts, and feels she is taking our concerns seriously. Jason and Gail expressed that they plan to attend the March CMSC meeting and should have more information to share at our March meeting. Fred made a motion that there be a vote by our membership to decide if Stark County Ski Club will remain in CMSC and Al Brancifort seconded the motion. A vote could be taken at the April Meeting.

Miscellaneous: If you are interested in next year' gear, specifically Dynastar, Elan, Volkl or Blizzard, let Joyce (Ski Shack) know. She will start ordering for next year soon. Ed Macika reported he has information on a chalet that sleeps 10 and is located 1 mile from Holiday Valley. This property is listed on AirBnB and they will waive fees if you mention you are with the Club. Contact Ed for more info. Andy Findlay reported he has been encouraged to host the 2^{nd} annual Balloon Fest party and more details will come.

Meeting Adjournment




Stark County Ski Club Marketing - Gail Vogt
