A big thanks to Scott Hunsinger for doing a fantastic job the past two years as the trip committee chair!

And I would like to thank those of you for your warm welcome! I know I have big shoes to fill, and I will do my best to do that. I have seen the surveys and thank all of you that participated in that! That will help us have a better understanding of what everyone is looking for through this pandemic. We are talking with a couple of tour operators for our March week-long trip. We are looking at a direct flight to Denver, and skiing close to Denver in the areas of Keystone, Breckenridge, Beavercreek & Vail using Vail Resorts (Epic pass). This will keep us from making connecting flights to other parts of the country. Sorry to say that it's not looking like we will have an East trip this year. The H&H is still ago, and we are looking into Snowshoe as a two or three-day trip, and also possibly Timberline, Canaan Valley & Wisp, etc.

We are looking into self-drive trips where the club negotiates group rate lodging and lift—tickets, or tentatively using smaller buses with the option to upgrade to a 55 passenger bus.

The trip committee has been working through the pandemic, lining up air and negotiating pricing to these resorts in the West and a big THANKS goes out to the behind the scenes trip members that are doing that.

Hold at an earlier time of day?



## Summer Biking—Bill Bail

#### Description of the biking program

Our summer biking group meets on Tuesday evenings through August and we ride a section on the Ohio Erie Towpath between Akron and Navarre weather permitting. You ride at your own pace and go as far as you are comfortable with. Our rule of thumb is we ride out for 45 minutes, take a short break then return making the ride about an hour and a half long as a guideline. 
