The event will be much different from past years. The race committee is working with reduced participation for all race legs and staggered start times. The event has approval from the Stark County Health Dept. There will be no race expo, an after-party at the stadium, and no fans at the start/finish line. Runners will have race packets mailed, and they will receive a post-race box with metal, snack, drink, and blanket at the finish. Water will be 8 oz. bottles set on tables for runners to take as they pass. Water stop volunteers will be placing bottles on tables, with no contact with runners.

No tee shirts this year, but you do get one of the blankets.

Also, for volunteering, you can take part in the 5k on Saturday, May 1st, for free.

Volunteers are needed for:

Runner Packet Assembly - April 13, 14, & 15 - 10am to 8pm - volunteer for a few hours.

Finisher box assembly - April 20, 21, 23, 10am to 8pm - volunteer a few hrs.

Water stop set up - May 2nd early morning, deliver tables and water cases to marked stops.

Water Stop Volunteer - 4 per station - first runners kick off at 7 am

We still need volunteers for water stops the morning of race, May 2nd.

Also need volunteers to help a few hrs. with runner packet assembly for mailing during the week of April 12th between 10am and 8pm.

Also help with finisher boxes during the week of April 19th, 10am to 8pm.

Trip Committee Chair John Masalko

By the time you read this, the last trip for the season is on its way home! On the Breckenridge trip, we had a few fall off the trip, because of situations beyond our control. There are 21 of us in total that will be traveling by automobile, and United Airlines, leaving March 27th and returning April 1st. We are staying at the beautiful Beaver Run resorts and condominiums.

The trip committee is still chomping away on next season's trips and beyond. Art is doing the virtual meetings with the Mountain Travel symposium group, meeting with different tour operators and resort representatives. The trip committee has received a few quotes for next season, and I would like to say that the majority of the quotes are coming from Vail resorts, which means the Epic pass will be usable at these resorts. We are looking into Mt. Snow, VT., Sun Valley ID., and Park City UT. Sun Valley could be tricky depending on the Epic Pass you choose, but Mike's research notes that in past years vail has allowed people to upgrade as long as you do it before the September deadline of the full payment. Otherwise, the Epic Local Pass limits Sun Valley lifts to 2 days and 50% off regular-priced lift tickets after you have used your 2 included lifts. Please review the terms of the Epic Pass by following the Epic Pass Link below. We are also looking into Killington Vt., which is on the Ikon Pass, as a possible choice. As with all of our weekly trips, you do not have to have a pass, and optional lift ticket groupings will be available, but we like to keep our pass purchasing membership informed.

Update from Breckenridge via text to Mike to edit my article, the skiing is great! Received about 8" of snow on the 30th and skied powder in the morning. It continued snowing on top of the mountain throughout the day today.
