It's hard to believe we are getting ready to start up our 2023 efforts with AVI already! "The Village" is growing and so is the number of events! Last year we started in May. This year our first events are in April! We may have to do things a bit differently to manage all the events! Please be understanding as we navigate through this, as we feel like we are dealing with a double-edged sword! We're thinking about using some guidelines & checklists to try to keep things organized & fair to everyone. We will talk about this more at the April meeting, but here are a couple of ideas that we are considering. We'll be asking some of the more experienced workers to "guide" everyone to know more of the tasks that need to be done, instead of just doing them. We need more people to be more confident with all the things that need to be done before, during and after an event. We're not doing this to discourage anyone, but to be able to give more opportunities to help. We need to make sure we have the "right skill sets" in the stand for every event to have things run smoothly!

Below are some of the events on the schedule. DO NOT SIGN UP UNTIL THERE ARE CHECKIN TIMES & how many people AVI wants us to have. This is only being shared for your information at this time. As in previous years, you will receive emails to recruit volunteers when we have the information from AVI. You will receive an acknowledgement of your request with whether you are working or if you are on-deck.

Please wear black or khaki bottoms (slacks, shorts or capris). Wear any solid-colored shirt. Wear comfortable close toed shoes. Have your hair tied back. Remember we are serving food! Think about what you would expect of those preparing your food! Consider the weather. A jacket or sweater is ok to wear. When you arrive at the stadium, check-in at the small brick building, just inside the Symphony Gate, on the SW corner of the stadium. You will sign in, pick up an apron and an AVI hat. After you have worked a couple of events, you will receive a Stark County Ski Club hat to wear!

We consider this a community activity! We also get exposure for Stark County Ski Club! You will receive a Trip Discount Voucher for each event you volunteer for, which will help you pay for your trips with SCSC! **Newbies are welcome!**
