View from the Top– Jason S.

Skiers and Riders,

From the drone of cicadas to kick off on Friday nights and Marching Bands, the sounds of the summer's end are in the air. Vail has just sent out their opening dates for their western resorts but smartly left Midwest and east coast as TBD weather permitting. Yes, fall is just around the corner. Monthly meetings will start back up in September with a new but very familiar meeting place. Bogie's 19th hole at Meadowlake. It's the old rafters where we had previously held monthly meetings for several years. They will have a limited menu for the meetings, which should help alleviate slow service we had in the past, and the new owners have updated the kitchen. The executive committee has held a meeting there and the food is great. Hopefully the attendance for the meetings improves. The club is exploring some new ideas to market the club and is looking at advertising in some local papers and social media. Does your home or neighborhood have a local paper/flyer that goes out monthly? Let us know! We have a new tri-fold flyer (designed by Alyssa) that we will be using to replace the old business cards, hopefully we can give a few out to folks to put up their local community bulletin board, YMCA, place of business etc.

What tools do you take out on the slopes with you? Most snowboarders carry a small snowboard tool with multiple bits to tighten loose bolts on bindings and or replace frequently broken parts like straps, but as a skier do you have any tools that you carry in your jacket? One useful tool you should carry especially at the beginning of each season is a gummy stone. Why?... As the season kicks off, most of us get our skies tuned to start the season some techs will slightly detune the skies slightly after sharpening the edges some don't. If you notice your skis are super responsive after a tune to the point where it is uncomfortable to ski, a quick hit with the gummy stone on the contact points of the ski will slightly take off some of the sharpness and detune the ski, making that the tech screwed up my ski's to saving the day after you already purchased the lift ticket. What are the contact points? They are the outer most point of contact on the rounded part of shaped skis, think of the ski as a big shovel or spoon, there will be two points at the front of the ski (inner and outer) and two at the back of the ski. A quick rub of the gummy over the sharp point edge will take a little of the sharpness away.
